Every part of the illustration is explained: the vase, Achilles, Ajax, spears, game.

> The Odyssey: a passage-long explanation of the Odyssey and a vase illustration of Odysseus blinding the cyclops. The information available is on a pointed stick, Cyclops and the vase.

Homer: Homer's bust, and a brief explanation about the poet.

Ancient Greek Warriors: a photo of a man dressed as an Athenian hoplite. The info page provides a passage-long information on the phalanx and the other information available from the photo is on shields, armour, crest, breastplate, greaves, and helmets.

The Trojan Horse: a passage-long explanation and a statue relief of the horse with the following information: on the relief, horse, hidden army, warriors.
